Coordinating Efforts for Falls Prevention in Iowa through Local Coalitions Mini Grant Opportunity

Falls are the leading causes of injury and injury-related death among lowa adults aged 65 and older. Preventing falls requires a strong, coordinated community effort. The <u>lowa Falls Prevention Coalition (IFPC)</u>, in partnership with the lowa Department of Health and Human Services, is excited to announce an opportunity to support the development of up to five **Local Falls Prevention Coalitions** in lowa. These coalitions will bring together health professionals, community organizations, older adults and other stakeholders to work collaboratively to reduce falls-related risks, promote awareness, and strengthen prevention strategies.

Through the <u>2025 State Falls Prevention Coalitions funding opportunity</u> from the National Council on Aging (NCOA) and with support and technical assistance from the IFPC, this mini grant aims to:

- Strengthen collaboration among healthcare providers, aging services, community organizations, and community members, including older adults and their caregivers.
- Promote community awareness and education around falls risks and prevention strategies.
- Expand access to evidence-based falls prevention programs hosted by community-based organizations or healthcare entities.
- Foster clinic partnerships for falls risk screening, assessment and referral to falls prevention education and programs.
- Support community-driven approaches that reduce falls-related injuries and improve quality of life for older adults.

Funding Available: \$25,000

Number of Awards anticipated: Up to five (5)

Funding per award: Up to \$5,000 per funded local coalition

Eligible Applicants: Organizations located within lowa, including nonprofits, local

health departments, hospitals, and Area Agencies on Aging.

Required Activities:

- Attend meetings with other funded local coalitions to receive technical assistance, share best practices, and engage in peer learning.
- Participate in Iowa Falls Prevention Coalition meetings every other month to stay informed on statewide initiatives and contribute local insights.
- Adopt a clear process for obtaining member commitment and maintaining an active membership list.
- Hold local coalition meetings at least every other month to coordinate activities, share updates, and plan collaborative efforts.
- Recruit at least one older adult member (age 65 or older) to ensure the coalition reflects the perspectives of the population it serves.

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- Assist with identification and recruitment of partners to strengthen communityclinical linkages for falls prevention.
- Submit a monthly summary of coalition activities, successes and lessons learned to the IFPC and Iowa HHS for inclusion in reporting to the National Council on Aging.

Use of Funds May Include:

- Convening and coordination activities
- Training and capacity-building
- Community outreach and education
- Promotion of evidence-based falls risk screening and falls prevention programs

Application Components: Interested organizations should submit a brief application (no more than 3 pages, excluding budget). Please see Appendix A for the scoring rubric, which provides additional guidance.

Applications should include the following components:

- 1. Organizational background and mission.
- 2. Define and list county(ies) included in the proposed coalition's catchment area.
- 3. Description of need.
- 4. Description of organizational readiness and capacity to lead or support coalition activities. This includes a commitment to actively maintain alignment with the IFPC, including designating a representative to participate in IFPC meetings and supporting the statewide strategies and initiatives.
- 5. Key partners (current and potential) who will be engaged.
- 6. Proposed approach to building and sustaining an active local coalition.
- 7. Preliminary budget or funding needs, up to \$5,000 for the duration of the project period.

- Project period: December 1, 2025 September 30, 2026

Iowa Falls Prevention Coalition - Mini-Grant Scoring Rubric

Criteria	Description	Points
Organizational Background & Mission	Demonstrates relevant experience, alignment with falls prevention or community health, and capacity to manage funds.	10
Catchment Area (County[ies]) & Need	Clearly identifies the area, including county(ies), to be served and provides a compelling description of local need related to falls prevention.	15
Capacity to Lead/Support Coalition	Shows readiness and ability to convene, coordinate, and sustain coalition activities. Staffing, structure, or past experience described.	15
Partnerships	Identifies existing and potential partners (healthcare, aging services, community-based organizations, older adults, caregivers, etc.). Includes plan to build/strengthen collaboration.	15
Approach to Coalition Building & Sustainability	Provides a clear, feasible strategy for coalition development, coordination, and long-term sustainability.	15
Implementation of Evidence-Based Falls Prevention	Strong plan to integrate falls risk screening, referrals, and evidence-based programs/classes.	15
Budget & Use of Funds	Budget is reasonable, aligns with allowable activities (convening, training, outreach, etc.), and clearly supports proposed work.	10
Impact & Outcomes	Proposal demonstrates potential to reduce falls- related risks, promote awareness, and improve quality of life for older adults.	5
